<u>Cedarview Middle School Council</u> <u>Minutes of the Meeting Held December 13, 2005</u>

The meeting was called to order at 7:15 PM by Paul Churchill, Chair.

- 1. The agenda was approved with the added items of Mr. Mozzarella and Parents Voice in Education. Moved Paul Churchill; seconded Margaret Zafiriou.
- 2. Approval of November 18 minutes with highlighted minor changes from Melanie Buchanan via Pauline McKenna. Moved Paul Churchill; seconded Michele Nielsen.
- 3. Treasurer's Report Karen Acton
 - a) No final numbers yet from QSP profit is roughly \$35,000
 - b) Our insurance has been paid \$170
 - c) We are short \$169 from the clothing sale; Karen will check with Patty re. sales; we do not charge for NSF cheques as we do not get charged for handling them.
- 4. Principal's Report Pauline McKenna
 - a) the parent volunteer who will be updating the website met with Mme. Girard to see what information will go on the site
 - b) The Ministry is looking at 20 minutes per day of physical activity per student sustained, moderate exercise. They are requesting feedback.
 - c) The professional activity day on December 2 was used by staff to attend an anti-racial workshop. There will be another two in March and May. One will focus on assessment and evaluation of students.
 - d) Teacher Trina Piche organized a fund raiser for the family of a Grade 6 student who lost all their belongings in a house fire. They raised \$650 plus donations of clothing.
 - e) The school was awarded \$1040 from Staple's for recycling printer cartridges through their store. There was some discussion on this, as well as congratulations for recycling.
 - f) Mr. Colin Clark did a workshop with band members.
 - g) About 30 people attended the Math night for parents.
 - h) This first term has been a good start to the year.

- b) Community Partners/Neighbourhood Watch
- Paul and Melanie Buchanan attended a meeting of this group. The focus was on the amount of vandalism happening to school properties. There was also discussion of

reviving the Neighbourhood Watch program in neighbourhoods. (<u>www.neighbourhoodwatchbarrhaven.com</u>). On February 6, 2006 a parent information night will be held on youth issues and problems. More information to follow later. Our school is hosting the next meeting of this group in February.

- c) OCASC we have no representative but have paid our dues and are receiving the information.
- d) Web site previously reported on by Pauline McKenna
- e) Minutes/notice of meetings/agendas by email. These will continue to be sent out by email and the idea is also to have them available on the web site.
- f) Book sale Michele Nielsen reported that sales were \$1465 yielding the school \$630 in books for the library which we have already taken. Thanks to Michele for organizing and running the Scholastic sale.
- g) Mr. Mozzarella made \$150.48 from the last Mr. Mozza weekend. The next one will be held on January 20/21. Margaret also has coupon books from Mr. Mozzarella which cost \$10 – all the profit goes to the school.
- h) Parents Voice in Education from OCASC
- The province has introduced a new policy called the Ontario Parent Involvement Policy which has allocated 5.2 million dollars to basically get parents more involved in their children's educations and to bridge some of the communication gaps between new Canadians and the schools they attend.
